Minimum GPA	None	Minimum 3.0 Overall GPA
Minimum Exam	None	21 ACT or 1060 SAT

Note: \*GED students must be no older than age 19 by September 1 of their freshman year in order to be eligible

#### What we need from From Students

- Register
- Complete FAFSA ASAP
- Check email *regularly*
- *Read* emails
- Ask questions early



#### **Detroit Promise Eligibility Notes**

- Requirements are "AND" as opposed to "OR"
- Last dollar scholarship
- Pell/TIP funding will ALWAYS be applied first
- Tuition and *mandatory* fees **ONLY**





#### **Important Notes – What Should Students Do?**

- Register for Detroit Promise (Dec 15)
- Submit college applications (Feb 15)
- Complete the FAFSA (March 1)
- □ Check FAFSA status with fin aid office (every month)
- □ Share ACT and SAT retake scores with your counselor
- Pay deposit to college of choice, if required (May 1)
- □ Sign Detroit Promise Release form (May 1)
- ❑ Submit final transcripts and final test scores to college

- Must be spent at partnering community colleges
- Only covers up to 7 credits
- Requires an appeal
